NETCO'S 2012 ANNUAL TRAINING CONFERENCE – A RESOUNDING SUCCESS!

The Halifax waterfront was the backdrop for the training conference sponsored by the National Electrical Trade Council (NETCO) on Aug. 19, 2012. This professional development opportunity is targeted to stakeholders supporting apprenticeship and journeyperson skills training in the electrical industry. It drew 32 delegates from across Canada.



Thank you to the *Electrical Joint Training Committee—IBEW, Local 213 and ECABC* for sponsoring a feature presentation on the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Training Program (EVITP) rolled out in the USA. EVITP is a structured platform for delivering training and certification for the installation of Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment (EVSE) across residential, commercial and public markets. It is endorsed by the National Joint Apprenticeship & Training Committee (NJATC). Ryan Bradt, Assistant Director/Instructor, Northwest Washington Electrical Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee, delivered a riveting presentation. His message was that the electrical contracting industry needs to embrace emerging electric vehicle technology early by developing training and certification based on national standards. The conference delegates recommended that NETCO lead a national EVITP strategy in Canada.

Thank you to *IBEW*, *Local 424* and the *ECAA* for sponsoring a presentation highlighting a best practice model for analyzing the language demands of the trade and relating those demands to the Canadian Language Benchmarks (CLB). They co-sponsored the development of a leading-edge report conducted by Karen Hammond, President of Hammond & Associates Inc. Karen used an interactive approach to explain the CLB framework and to explore the implications for learning and training. The conference delegates took away strategies, tools and resources to communicate across cultures and to facilitate the integration of internationally trained electricians. The sponsors generously provided copies of the *Electrician's Photo Reference Guide* developed as a resource for internationally trained electricians, electricians who speak English as a Second Language and/or electricians who are new to working in an industrial context.

"BASIC FOREMANSHIP" COURSE PILOTS COMPLETED

October 11-12th in Lansing Michigan saw the completion of the three part product testing for the much anticipated NECA Management Education Institute (MEI) on-line "Basic Foremanship" course. The final "Advanced" (formerly dubbed "Excel") unit was delivered at the NECA Michigan Chapter offices by Dr. Jerald Rounds to a group of 20 owners, estimators, senior foremen and subject experts. For the first time anywhere, this group was treated to a completed "Basic" unit "Video Learning Module". The response by the audience was overwhelmingly favourable (not an easy feat in our trade!). The conclusion of the day and a half vetting session provided the final touches in fine tuning the delivery of this "Flipped Classroom Concept" course, set for delivery in 2013.

GOVERNMENT RELATIONS UPDATE

As reported in July's newsletter, the focus for establishing the first effective "Prompt Payment Legislation" (PPL) in Canada, has been in Ontario. Through NTCCC's Ontario counterparts, a workable piece of legislation is being hammered out, mirroring the industry collaborated CCDC contracts. At a recent COCA function at Queens Park in September 2012 we have been encouraged that PPL has the support of all three political parties in Ontario. The final document to be presented to the government's legal counsel is going through the final touches. We will continue to update you on developments in this area.




