	qualification,
	(ii) working for an electrical contractor as a licensed professional engineer registered
	with the Professional Engineers of Ontario, or
	(iii) working for an electrical contractor in the capacity of a certified engineering
	technician or a certified engineering technologist registered with the Ontario Association
	of Certified Engineering Technicians and Technologists;
	(c) have passed the master electrician qualifiying examination within the 12-month
	period preceding the date of the application; and
